- Research and observe birds out in nature, in books or online.
- Decide which kind of bird you want to create. (This could be a bird of your own imagination!)
- Include details such as eyes, beak/mouth, wings, feet, and habitat.
- Use collage style to create your bird.

<u>Collage</u>- a piece of art made by sticking various materials such as photographs, seeds, beans, pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.

Have fun! Observe some birds outside. Listen to them singing! Springtime is here!

9. K-5 Drawing with scissors!

Pretend you are the famous artist, Henri Matisse. **He created pictures by cutting paper and glueing it down.** Try to fill the page and include lots of details or "clues" and have fun!

- What kind of picture will you make from the pieces of paper that you cut out?
 - Your favorite animal and its habitat?
 - Your favorite sports or hobbies?
 - A special place that you like to visit?
 - An underwater picture with fish and sea animals?
 - A favorite toy, stuffed animal or game?
- Can you guess what Matisse was thinking about when he made this paper cutting? (The answer is on the next page)

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The title of Matisse's picture is *Beasts of the Sea* or animals of the ocean.


- Can you see all the details he cut out to create an underwater picture?

Silhouette landscape with warm and cool colors

<u>Silhouette</u> - A representation of something showing the shape and outline only. (k-5)

- Pencil sketch landscape (remember your "landline" -horizon line/ where the land and the sky meet.)
- Color all objects above horizon line black for silhouette effect.
- Add detail to ground area if you'd like.
- color/paint warm color sky (red, orange and yellow)
- color/paint land in cool colors (blue, green and violet)
- Stand back and smile! Nice work!

Warm and cool colors review:

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Warm colors – such as **red**, **yellow**, and **orange**; evoke warmth because they remind us of things like the sun or fire.

Cool colors — such as **blue**, **green**, and purple (**violet**); evoke a cool feeling because they remind us of things like water or grass.
