<u>Intent:</u> Plan is designed so that students do not fall significantly behind during the period away from school. Activities are interactive and students should complete assignments, but not necessarily in the presence of an adult. The goal is to ensure academic progress in the core academic areas. The sample home schedule will show you an example of a predictable day (next page).

• Responsibility of the parent/guardian:

- A designated school work time in a space that is free of distraction.
- Students are ready for instruction at the time designated as academic time and make every effort to complete school assignments.
- Notify teachers of difficulty and or concerns by email.

• Responsibility of the students:

- o To do the work provided by their teachers to the best of their ability.
- <u>Daily Structure:</u> Many families have asked what the days at home should look like. A predictable day will help students stay on track and feel secure. The plans from teachers are put together using the daily sample set-up shown below to help provide a routine to multiple learning days with family at home. **Of course this schedule is just a suggestion.** We do recommend some type of schedule so students know what their role is during a distant learning day.

To Do: Read from your PALS folder. Choose a page with phrases. Read the phrases many times until they sound like speech. If your reading gets too slow, back up and try again. Keep practicing until it sounds very good.

Writing: Go to Google Classroom

Purpose: Practice spelling, writing and keyboard skills.

To Do: In the message box, type one thing you learned from the story Animal Groups.

Reading: Journeys - Lesson 15 - Animal Groups

Purpose: Read with fluency, comprehend

To Do: Read *Animal Groups* again. It should sound better today.

Read pg. 162 - Discuss what a Venn Diagram is and how it is used to "Compare = alike" and "Contrast = different." Try making your own Venn diagram or you may use the example I put in Classroom for you. Try to Compare and Contrast Amphibians vs. Reptiles. What are some things that make them different (outer parts of the diagram) and what are some things that they both share (inner overlap of the circles)?

Phonics/Fluency/Grammar: Fundations

Purpose: Reinforce previously taught phonics skills, decoding, encoding and reading.

To Do: In your Fundations Student Notebook:

- -Turn to **Hh** page in the first $\frac{1}{2}$ of your book: Write the word hang and the sentence **Mom will hang the red dress**.
- Turn to **Ww** page in the first ½ of your book: Write the word wing and the sentence **The bug has a black wing.**

^{**}Remember to use your very best handwriting and make sure to use capitals and end marks.

Writing: Directed Drawing of an animal

Purpose: Following directions and using text features to label drawing.

To Do: After you have completed Ms. Whitaker 's directed drawing, finish coloring and adding detail. Then label your animal parts. Create a Heading/Title for your drawing and put it at the top in BOLD letters.
